

Sunday 17 July 2016: Magor Marsh

Members of the Lower Wye Ramblers were treated to a five-mile guided walk of Magor Marsh Nature Reserve and the surrounding area led by Gwent Wildlife Trust Reserve Officer Richard Bakere.

The walk began in the Reserve itself, where Richard spoke about the successful reintroduction of the water vole and the other wildlife found in the area. Leaving the Reserve, the group headed to the village of Redwick, where they paused for a break outside the beautiful village church of St Thomas the Apostle. The walk then continued to the coastal wall, which offered great views over the water and a scenic location to enjoy lunch on a sunny day. After lunch, the group walked along the coastal path for a while before heading inland again along country roads back to the Reserve.
